Nova Scotia Power provides 95 per cent of the generation, transmission and distribution of electricity in Nova Scotia, and serve over 500,000 residential, commercial and industrial customers across the province. Their 1,700 dedicated, safety-focused employees help manage \$5 billion worth of generation, transmission and distribution assets and produce more than 10,000 gigawatt hours of electricity each year.
